Dear Parent/Guardian

At your request, your child has been registered to take the SEAG Entrance Assessment in Centre: **THORNHILL COLLEGE** on **Saturday 11th and Saturday 25th November 2023**.

We plan to hold a Familiarisation Session on **Tuesday 24th October at 4.15pm for a viewing of the Examination Venue**. **Your child should be accompanied by one adult only** on the above date for familiarisation.

On Saturday 11th and Saturday 25th November your child must bring a **printed SEAG Information Card** as proof of identity and present it on arrival at the Assembly Hall entrance where your child will be met by a member of staff. It will not be possible for parents to enter the school beyond this entrance. Your child will be taken to the welcome area for a short time to allow their registration to be completed, before being taken to the Sports Hall where they will take the assessment along with other children from their Primary school. It is important that your child arrives **between 9.00am and 9.15am**. Children arriving after the assessment has begun will not be admitted to the assessment room as they will have missed the important instructions and practice questions.

Please take time to read these instructions:

- It is important that your child does not bring a mobile phone, iPod, MP3/4 Player, iWatch or any products with an Electronic Communication/Storage Device or Digital Facility into the school on the Assessment days. Do not bring a watch – there will be a clock in the room.
- Your child does not need to bring anything relating to the assessment with them, (e.g. pencils, paper etc.) as everything will be provided by our school. Rulers are not allowed* (*unless a non-graduated reading ruler has been approved as an Access Arrangement).
- Children should wear their Primary school uniform.
